If you are arriving at Nottingham train station you can either walk from the station (approx. 5/10 minutes) or else take the tram one stop to Lace Market (towards Phoenix Park / Hucknell)

On Wednesday morning it is suggested that you take tram heading towards Toton Lane and alight at University tram stop (walk through Highfield Park / South Entrance of University of Nottingham and head towards the Hallward Library on University of Nottingham main campus (TBS). Return tram tickets can be purchased from the machines at the tram stop or else there are buses to the university (no 36, 5) that go from Market Square / Angel Row and head to University via Derby Road.
